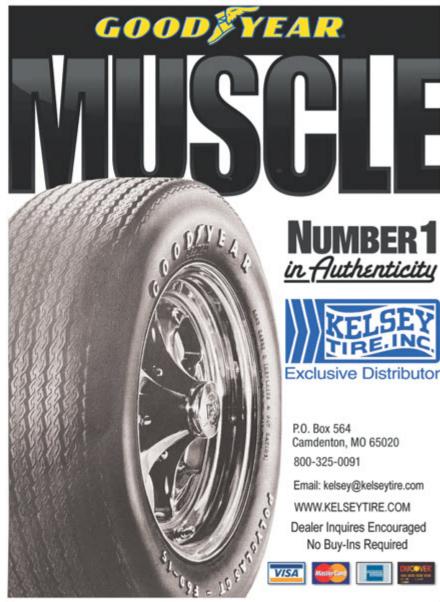

and door sill plates.

I have previously discussed making the rear 1/4 panels, the rear panel and the package tray. The upholstery shop has received the head liner and so I now need to get the windlace installed. I will measure the length of the material needed and get it from the upholstery shop. It is time to get to work.

Number 1

Sometimes there are many things going on at the same time. One thing I need to mention is that I rewired the dome light and the switch. The wire for the power for the light comes off the headlight switch and is call "Body Feed". I cleaned the light and repainted it white. I installed new wires and tested the circuit before I went any further so that I would be ready when the headliner was in. Note that there are two circles cut into in the wood. Be sure of which one you need to cut out when the time comes. I am adding this in now so that I won't forget to get the wires and bracket in before I start.

Number 4

I decided to just take a picture of the finished area to show what I can't seem to describe. The small area under the windshield frame from the top of the dash. This hides everything and finishes it off. You fold over a little of the material to have a nice fold of material at the dash. What ever the excess is that you have had sewed on you can just cut it off.

Number 5

The factory must have had a pneumatic nail gun to "nail" the windlace to the door jamb. I drill a small hole and use a #4 sheet metal screw and a small flat washer to hold the windlace to the door jamb.







Number 6

I have the windlace all the way to the floor installed and you can see how the last 6 inches will be tucked under the rug when it is finished.

Number 7

Windlace installed going past the windshield area where the extra material goes.

I am trying to add the "cat claws" to installation. With the cat claws you just "tuck' the headliner under them and it holds the headliner material. The car was not made to have them and they just did not work and I took them out when I started installing the headliner. The headliner will have a "wireon" to go around the door opening to finish off the installation on the headline and these just did not work.

Number 9

I have the new headliner from the upholstery shop now and I have it laid out on on my plywood table. I have all the bows identified and put a piece of tape on the individual pockets where the bows will slide into.







Number 10 Here are a few of the bows that I am using.

Number 11

I have installed all the bows in to the individual pockets. Now I have to figure out how to put it in the car.





Number 12, 12A
I used a closet wooden clothes hanger closet pole to hold the back half of the headliner. This helps keep it off the floor. I have it hanging by the center bow and now the fun begins. I have my stool to sit on inside the car.

Number 13

I am just trying to get parts of the headliner out of the way. I taped the front of the headliner to the windshield and used a rope to hold some of the headliner out of the way. I have to get to the back of the car and get the bows ready to hang. I have a couple tools in the rear window to be ready to bend tabs to hold the bows in place. The bows have "catches" in the roof line that you pull the bow, with the headliner material surrounding it.



Number 14, 14A
The bow in this section is basically





floating on top of the metal brace. That metal brace will also be where the headliner is stapled to. I will make fillers that go around the rear windows and stops here at the headliner. The rear window frame is just below this area. More on this later.

Number 15 This is the rear window and the bows are in the pockets of

the headliner. They will actually catch in a set of holders in the roof.

Number 16

I am starting to pull some of the headliner to the front just to try and stretch it just a little.

Number 17, 17A

Working the headliner in the door area. I want to point out the "strings" on the end of the headliner. You have to be careful of them that they don't unravel on you. Use super glue on the ends until your ready to cut it off and then use super glue on it again.

Number 18

I have jumped to the back of the car again. You can see where the bows will be positioned with the metal tabs. I bend the tabs over to capture the bow which is inside the pocket.

Number 19, 19A I am getting close to the rear



window and I have the padding in place around the window. The

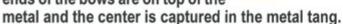














Number 20

The back of the headliner is starting to take shape I have all the bows "captured" now in the metal tabs that are part of the roof supports. It will be a process of pulling it around the 1/4 window and and the back windows. Only problem is that with all the material of the headliner I can't see a thing as it is in the way.

Number 21

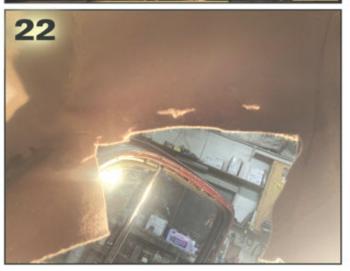
I have the headliner pulled to the front and put a couple staples in it around the windshield but not of the sides yet.



I will be pulling the front of the headliner and putting a few staples around the windshield and then on the sides around the doors. I will be doing the same in the back pulling to the sides and around the rear windows. Pulling and tugging on the material on the front and the back and also side to side. I do this a couple times until I get the headliner the way I want it.

Number 22

I have cut some of the extra material off the door opening.





Number 23

I could not see a thing and I just need to cut some of the material and get it out of my way. I pulled on the material and put some screws in the window opening to hold the headliner in place. There is a lot of material in the package tray that is in the way but I need to put the panel in to see just where I can trim the material. I do have the panel board in place but needs to be covered. I will be using some screws and washers (like I did for the windlace) in the top of the package tray. I have to pull the headliner down and hold it tight. (Continued next month with Part Two)

"The specs on the cylinder lists -52 F as its freeze point, but it works best at normal room temperature."

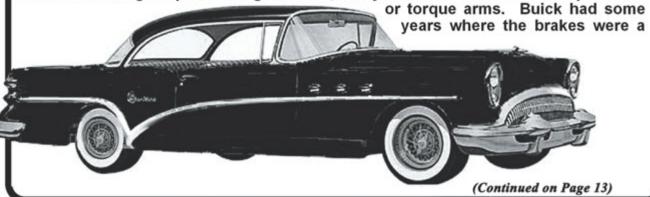
"Normal room temperature!" Sandy huffed as he came in. "Feels colder than that in here to me!"

"A 1954 Buick Century 2 door hardtop. The Century was considered a 'Gentleman's Hot Rod' at the time. It used the smaller Special body with the big 322 CID V-8 Roadmaster engine that had intro'ed in 1953. Buick had made a few changes in the new V-8. The '53's had some 'pinging' and acceleration problems. Buick tried in late '53 to fix this by changing the vacuum advance, but the remedy was to make the '54 pistons about one-half inch lower and decreasing the combustion chambers, eliminating the pinging and hesitation during acceleration." Pop

"The Dynaflows were better than ever, with the twin turbine design, eliminating most of the slipping feeling during acceleration, and you could actually squeal the tires from a stop, in low. Buick kept its torque tube through 1963 and it was known for absorbing rear axle twist, letting the rear springs take the full brunt of braking and accelerating torque. During the '50's, many of the race cars used torque tubes

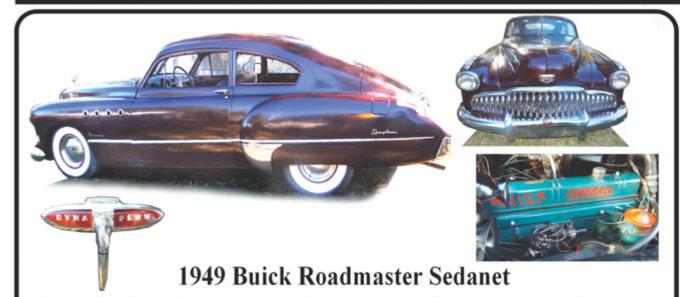

Pop replied, "In '54, Buick's power assist was improved. If you chose the power brake option, you could get vacuum assist with an electric pump that automatically kicked in via a relay that cut in when the engine

speed dropped to a low RPM, eliminating the possibility of having the required pedal pressure change without warning due to a vacuum manifold pressure drop. They worked quite well," he said.

Just then, Bay One door went up and Jack drove his sleek Carlsbad Black '54 2-door hardtop Century in.

"Nice car!" was everyone's reaction.

The guys walked to the front as the smooth V-8 was turned off. The grill was a design feature first seen on Harley Earl's 'Y-Job' and it was a one-year-only. It had Buick's vertical chrome bar design with a top bar that rolled downward on each side.

"Sort of a frown with an attitude," Jack said.

The headlight housings were like the '53's with a single headlight and one round park light below, both housed in a single headlight ring. The bumper had the familiar 'Dagmars' so popular in the '50's and above the grill was the word 'BUICK' tightly set in condensed block letters. The hood ornament was a chrome circle with a 'V' in the center, with a long chrome spear piercing it. On the front fenders were only three portholes, the same as the Special and Super. The Roadmaster had four."

Yes it is, Pop. When I bought the car, the previous owner said he had re-wired the primary circuit."

"Let's look at the system," Pop suggested, as Jack opened the hood.

"It's a 12 volt negative ground system with an 'external' resistor. The ignition is composed of two circuits: The Primary and the Secondary. The 12 volt primary consists of Battery, Resistor (or resisting wire), Ignition Switch, Primary winding coil, Distributor, Contact Points, Capacitor and Low-voltage Wiring connections.

The secondary includes Secondary Wiring in Coil, Distributor, Spark Plugs and Cables. Your system is missing something in the Primary Circuit connecting the ignition switch with the primary coil windings. This missing piece is to limit to a safe maximum the amount of primary current flowing through the coil and distributor contact. When the engine is running the _____reduces the battery voltage to the coil and distributor to 7-8 volts. This reduced voltage protects the contact points at low engine speeds when the points are closed for longer intervals," Pop

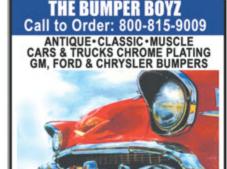

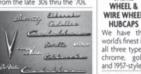

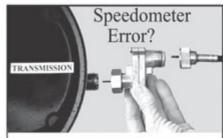

- 6. The first postwar Studebaker Convertibles were 1946's.
- 7. Packard's first year for a post-WWII convertible was 1948.
- 8. In 1941, Chevy produced a coupe pickup "Ute" that had a small load bed in the trunk opening.
- 9. 1940 Buick Specials could be ordered with a "sunroof" option.
- 10. 1946 Buick Super and Roadmasters featured fenders that flowed from the headlights to the rear fenders, and were called "Air Foil" fenders.

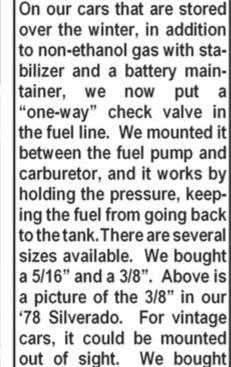
